

"For this is what the Lord says— God who created the heavens, only God is God; God who fashioned and made the earth, God who founded it; God did not create it to be empty but formed it to be inhabited— God says: 'I am the Lord, and there is no other.'"

Isaiah 45:18

This Earth Week, let us renew our vision within creation and see both the beauty and responsibility of being human in God's world. The abundance of the Earth is a reflection both of the complexity of God's being and the generosity of God's grace. Our call is to live into honouring creation's abundance with reverent celebration, rather than seeing it as resources exploit. EcoJustice and Climate Justice are part of God's calling to the United Church, and particularly, we are called to witness the injustice in the ecosystems within which we make our lives.

Faithful witness to this injustice inevitably leads to the discipleship of deep questions and envisioning broad journeys. We must not lose heart in the face of steep climbs or clouded paths, we must begin. We are called to be in community with creation and with one another, we are called to begin where we are with what we have. We are called to be resourceful, intentional, connected, and both inward- and outward-looking: let us live into this calling together.

Gathering and Approach (responsive)

WL: Greetings, and welcome to this place of worship and connection in the name of Christ. As we gather, we acknowledge the traditional and ancestral territory of the (please identify upon whose territory you are gathering, and say their name here. This land acknowledgement is a reminder of our intention and investment in living into right relations with Indigenous peoples of Turtle Island.

All: We gather to open our hearts to one another, and to lift our hearts toward God. We gather to proclaim that all are welcome, **and to publicly, intentionally and explicitly affirm that people of all genders and sexualities are vibrant parts of God's image in which we are all lovingly created.

Lighting of the Christ Candle

WL: There once was a man called Jesus, who did such amazing things and said such wonderful things that people followed him. We rekindle this flame of love, hope, peace and

joy to call out to our Lord, and to remind us of Jesus' own words: "I am the way, the truth and the life." May the blessing of this light shine upon us and through us today and always. Amen

Call to Worship (responsive)

WL: Come! Let us worship our God! The God who created the heavens and the earth, the God who knows each blade of grass, each hair on our heads, each bird in the sky.

ALL: We come together to sing praise, to turn our faces toward God, and toward one another. Like spokes in a wheel, as we move closer toward God at the centre, we move closer toward one another. Let us worship our God!

¹⁹ For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God, ²⁰ for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope ²¹ that the creation itself will be set free from its enslavement to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. ²² We know that the whole creation has been groaning together as it suffers together the pains of labor, ²³ and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. ²⁴ For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope, for who hopes for what one already sees? ²⁵ But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

Let us pray that all living beings realize that they are all siblings, all nourished from the same source of life.

Let us pray that we ourselves cease to be the cause of suffering to each other. Let us plead with ourselves to live in a way which will not deprive other beings of air, water, food, shelter, or the chance to live.

With humility, with awareness of the existence of life, and of the sufferings that are going on around us, let us pray for the establishment of peace in our hearts and on earth. Amen.
